**Retreat Leader:**

*Rev. Robert Walsh*, a native of the Washington, DC area, was ordained to the priesthood in 2006 in the Archdiocese of Washington after matriculating from Immaculate Conception Seminary at Seton Hall University. He was first assigned to the Shrine of St. Jude in Rockville, MD as Parochial Vicar and currently serves as Priest Secretary to Cardinal McCarrick, Archbishop Emeritus of Washington, as well as Associate Director of Priest Vocations.

**Presenters:**

*Maria Barboza*, Program Officer for Hispanic Outreach and Global Solidarity for Catholic Relief Services (CRS) in the northeast. Maria was once a Peace Corps volunteer in Guatemala. Her work now includes reaching out to diverse ethnic communities. Topics she has presented on include the mission of the Church and fair trade, peace-building, and community development.

*Ted Miles* is a native of Baltimore and has worked for CRS since July 2005 as the religious education relationship manager and staff member in the agency's youth strategy program. Prior to joining CRS, he served as a Jesuit volunteer in Belize and Guatemala, a parish youth minister for seven years, a Catholic high school teacher for eight years, and a diocesan youth leader throughout this time. Ted has created an urban immersion experience called Justice Action Week for high school youth, and continues to serve as the project director. The Archdiocese of Baltimore recently awarded him their highest honor in youth ministry, the Cardinal Sheehan Award, for his commitment to young people.
